The Essence of Healing From Sexual Violence. The four domains of healing, the opposing responses that comprise them, and the process that results from the synthesis of the opposing responses, are depicted in Figure 1. The arrows between the opposing responses (e.g., keeping others out/seeking out others) reflect the synthesis of these responses.

Rates for Hispanic males (10/100,000) are more than three-and-one-half times the rate for white males. Between 1999 and 2014, more than 47,000 black males and more than 18,000 Hispanic males between the ages of 10 and 25 were victims of homicide [1]. Working with Latino Men & Boys to Eradicate Domestic Violence

Among the Latino community, the fear of getting deported, having their children taken away, or facing more violence are the top barriers perceived to prevent Latino immigrants from reporting domestic violence and sexual assault, a new report found. At least 41 percent of surveyed Latinos believe that the main reason that Latino immigrant victims don't seek help is because of deportation fears.
